MISCELLANEOUS RECORD

M.R. 1545 - In re: Uniform Schedule of Charges for Official Court Reporters' Transcripts.

In accordance with Section 5 of the Court Reporter Act, as amended (705 ILCS 70/5), the Supreme Court adopts the following Uniform Schedule of Charges for Court Reporters' Transcripts of evidence and proceedings:

1. Charges shall be computed on a "per page" basis.

2. Each page for which a charge is to be made shall meet the following minimum standards:

A page shall be 8 1/2 inches by 11 inches in size. The left-hand margin shall be not more than 1 1/2 inches from the left-hand edge of the paper and the right-hand margin shall not be more than 3/4 inch from the right-hand edge of the paper. Each page shall be pre-numbered on the left-hand margin and shall contain a minimum of 24 lines of type. The first line of any question or any answer may be indented not more than five spaces from the left-hand margin; the first line of any paragraph or other material may be indented not more than ten spaces from the left-hand margin. There shall not be more than one space between word nor more than two spaces between each sentence. Type pitch shall be not less than 9 characters per inch.

3. Charges for Regular Copy Delivery: (Delivery during the period allowed by law or rule or any extensions thereof).

(a) Private Pay Original	\$3.15 per page
All Other Original	\$1.80 per page

(b) Copies	\$.50 per page

4. Daily Copy Delivery: (Delivery within 24 hours after the close of proceedings or, during proceedings, before noon on the day following proceedings to be transcribed and delivered).

(a) Private Pay Original	\$4.20 per page
All Other Original	\$2.10 per page

(b) Copies	\$.75 per page

5. Orders for daily copy must be approved by the Judge to whom the case is assigned. If the Judge to whom the case is assigned is unavailable, a Judge of the circuit to which the case is

assigned may enter an order allowing the court reporting services employee to prepare daily copy.
