MISCELLANEOUS RECORD

M.R. 24161 - In re: Security Procedures.

Effective immediately, this order supersedes and replaces all prior orders of this Court on these subjects and establishes the security procedures to screen all persons entering the Supreme Court Building in Springfield, Illinois.

Procedures

Screening of Persons Entering the Building

1. Screening will be conducted during normal Court business hours and at other times as directed by the Marshal or his/her designee.
2. The Marshal and/or Deputy Marshals of the Supreme Court shall operate an X-ray machine and a walkthrough magnetometer at the public entrance on the first floor of the Supreme Court Building (referred to hereafter as the "Facility") for the purpose of screening persons entering the building. All persons and their belongings are subject to search by the Marshal and/or Deputy Marshals while in this Facility. Alternatively, the person being searched may be allowed to terminate the search process, collect his/her property and exit the building at any time.
3. All persons (except those indicated in Item 5) having business with the Court or any other office in this Facility shall pass through the walkthrough magnetometer for the purpose of detection of firearms, explosives, pepper spray, incendiary devices, knives, or any other item prohibited by law, regulation or court order from introduction into this Facility. These persons shall submit to further screening by the Marshal and/or Deputy Marshals if the readings of the magnetometer indicate the presence of metallic objects. This further screening may encompass the removal of all metallic objects on their person, screening by a portable hand-held metal detector, or other screening procedures as

necessary. Any person refusing to submit to this screening process shall be denied access to this Facility.

4. All persons (except those indicated in Item 5) having business with the Court or any other offices in this Facility who are carrying, delivering or otherwise transporting any briefcase, suitcase, package, electronic device, or any other containers (hereafter referred to as "carried item") shall surrender such carried item for screening through an X-ray device and/or personal inspection by the Marshal or Deputy Marshal. Any person refusing to submit the carried item for screening through an X-ray device and/or personal inspection by the Marshal or Deputy Marshal shall be denied access to this Facility. If the Marshal or Deputy Marshal concludes, after X-ray and/or personal inspection, that any item which the person seeks to bring into this Facility contains firearms, explosives, pepper spray, incendiary devices, knives, or any other dangerous item prohibited by law, regulation or court order, the individual may be subject to arrest.

5. Supreme Court Justices and full-time employees of the Supreme Court who work in the Supreme Court Building or others at the discretion of the Marshal or by further direction of the Court are exempt from the screening procedures set forth above.

6. Law enforcement officers with jurisdiction will be allowed to carry their regular duty weapons into the building with the exception of the courtroom when Court is in session or at other times at the discretion of the Marshal.

7. No person having authorized access to non-public areas after having passed through the screening devices or having authorized access via key or key fob shall permit any person access to those non-public areas, locked stairwell door or any other locked door in this Facility without proper written authorization from the employee's appropriate department manager.

8. Only full-time Supreme Court employees and any contract employees authorized by their appropriate department manager and possessing an authorized key fob may enter this Facility through any locked entrance. Such authorized employees' names and date(s) of authority shall be documented and submitted to the Marshal.

Cameras and Recording Devices

Cameras and recording devices are not permitted in the courtroom when Court is in session without prior authorization by the Court for a specific occurrence or pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 63(A)(7); M.R. No. 2634.

Cellular Phones, Pagers and Related Electronic Equipment

The use of cellular phones in the courtroom while Court is in session is prohibited. Cellular phones may be used in the public hallway so long as such use does not disrupt the courtroom or other official proceedings.

Violations

A violator of this order is subject to arrest and may be charged with any applicable criminal offense and/or contempt of court. Property brought into this Facility or used herein in violation of this Order is subject to confiscation and forfeiture upon court order.
