MISCELLANEOUS RECORD

M.R.24762 - In re: Thomas Richard Glasson. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Hearing Board is allowed. The petition by Thomas Richard Glasson for reinstatement to the roll of attorneys licensed to practice law in Illinois pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 767 is allowed, subject to the following conditions which shall be applicable during the first four (4) years following Thomas Richard Glasson's reinstatement:

a. Petitioner shall comply with the provisions of Article VII of the Illinois Supreme Court Rules on Admission and Discipline of Attorneys and the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall timely cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations relating to his conduct;

b. Petitioner shall attend meetings as scheduled by the Commission probation officer. Petitioner shall submit quarterly written reports to the Commission probation officer concerning the status of his practice of law and the nature and extent of his compliance with the conditions of reinstatement;

c. Petitioner shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change of address;

d. Petitioner shall abstain from the usage of alcohol and any unprescribed controlled substance;

e. Petitioner shall continue his involvement in the Florida Lawyers' Assistance Program, maintain a mentor therein, and attend at least two meetings a month, or a similar program acceptable to the Administrator, in which other professionals with similar issues participate;

f. Petitioner shall continue his involvement in a 12-step program, maintain a sponsor therein, and attend at least two meetings a week;

g. Petitioner shall provide the Administrator with the name, address, and telephone number of his mentor in the Florida Lawyers' Assistance Program and his sponsor in the 12-step program within fourteen (14) days of his reinstatement, and petitioner shall request the mentor and sponsor to communicate with the Administrator in writing on a quarterly basis regarding petitioner's participation in said programs and to report any lapse in petitioner's sobriety or usage of alcohol or unprescribed controlled substance within seventy-two (72) hours of learning of it;

h. Petitioner shall submit to random substance testing by a qualified mental health professional or facility approved by the Administrator, within eight (8) hours of receiving notice by the Administrator, or facility or person designated by the Administrator to provide such notice, that he shall submit to the testing. The results of the tests shall be reported to the Administrator. Petitioner shall pay any and all costs of such testing;

i. Petitioner shall report to the Administrator any lapse in his sobriety or usage of any unprescribed controlled substances within seventy-two (72) hours of that usage;

j. Petitioner shall continue in therapy with psychotherapist Mr. Steven Grossman, LCSW, CAP, or other psychotherapist acceptable to the Administrator, and shall comply with all treatment recommendations of the psychotherapist, and advise the Administrator of any change in treatment deemed warranted by the psychotherapist;

k. Petitioner shall provide to his therapist an appropriate release authorizing the treating professional to: (1) disclose to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis information pertaining to the nature of the petitioner's compliance with any treatment plan established with respect to the petitioner; (2) promptly report to the Administrator petitioner's failure to comply with the treatment plan; and (3) respond to any inquiries by the Administrator regarding petitioner's mental or emotional state or compliance with any established treatment plan; and

1. Petitioner shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change in treatment professionals.

M.R.24961 - In re: John J. O'Malley. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Hearing Board is allowed. The petition by John J. O'Malley for reinstatement to the roll of attorneys licensed to practice law in Illinois pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 767 is allowed, subject to the following conditions which shall be applicable during the first two (2) years following John J. O'Malley's reinstatement, unless otherwise noted:

a. Petitioner shall comply with the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall timely cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations relating to his conduct;

b. Petitioner shall attend meetings as scheduled by the Commission probation officer. Petitioner shall submit quarterly written reports to the Commission probation officer concerning the status of his practice of law and the nature and extent of his compliance with the conditions of reinstatement;

c. Petitioner shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change of address;

d. Petitioner's practice of law shall be supervised by a licensed attorney acceptable to the Administrator, and petitioner shall provide the name and address of that attorney to the Administrator. Petitioner shall authorize the supervising attorney to provide a report in writing to the Administrator, no less than once every quarter, regarding the nature of petitioner's work, the number of cases being handled by petitioner, and the supervisor's general appraisal of petitioner's continued fitness to practice law;

e. Petitioner shall abstain from the usage of alcohol and any unprescribed controlled substances. Petitioner shall report to the Administrator any lapse in his sobriety or usage of any unprescribed controlled substances within seventy-two (72) hours of that usage;

f. For the first year following reinstatement, petitioner shall submit to weekly substance testing by a qualified mental health professional or facility approved by the Administrator. The testing shall include an assessment for the presence of ethyl glucuronide. Provided abstinence is maintained, during the second year following reinstatement petitioner shall submit to random substance testing within eight (8) hours of receiving notice by the Administrator. The results of the tests shall be reported to the Administrator. Petitioner shall pay any and all costs of such testing;

g. Petitioner shall continue his participation in a 12-step program such as Alcoholics Anonymous by attending at least two (2) meetings per week. Petitioner shall keep a log of his attendance at the meetings and submit it to the Administrator with his quarterly reports;

h. Petitioner shall maintain a sponsor in the 12-step program and shall provide the name, address and telephone number of the sponsor to the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of entry of the Court's final order. Petitioner shall request that the sponsor communicate with the Administrator in writing on a quarterly basis regarding petitioner's participation and progress in the 12-step program and report any lapses in sobriety or usage of unprescribed controlled substances to the Administrator within seventy-two (72) hours of his knowledge of that usage; and

i. Petitioner shall engage in outpatient treatment with an individual accustomed to working with high functioning professionals with character disorders. Petitioner may fulfill this condition by continuing his participation in the Lawyers' Assistance Program ("LAP") under the supervision of a case manager and pursuant to the recommendations of the case manager. Petitioner shall request the case manager to communicate with the Administrator in writing on a quarterly basis regarding petitioner's participation in LAP programs.

M.R.25631 - In re: Robert Allan Holstein. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by respondent Robert Allan Holstein for leave to file exceptions to the report and recommendation of the Review Board is denied. Respondent is suspended from the practice of law for two (2) years, as recommended by the Review Board.

Suspension effective June 10, 2013.

Respondent Robert Allan Holstein shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Hearing Board is allowed, and respondent Lawrence Matthew Haws is suspended from the practice of law for two (2) years and until further order of the Court.

M.R.25942 - In re: Andrew Barry Spiegel. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Review Board is allowed, and respondent Andrew Barry Spiegel is suspended from the practice of law for eighteen (18) months and until he makes restitution to Roy Estes, Sr., in the amount of \$4,850.

Respondent Andrew Barry Spiegel shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Mark Joseph-Anthony Hughes, who has been disciplined in the State of Arizona, is disbarred in the State of Illinois.

M.R.25980 - In re: Anthony Bayard de Volo. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Anthony Bayard de Volo, who has been disciplined in the State of California, is suspended from the practice of law for one (1) year in the State of Illinois, with the suspension stayed by a two (2) year period of probation, subject to the condition that respondent be actually suspended for the first ninety (90) days of probation, and subject to other conditions of probation imposed upon respondent by the Supreme Court of California.
