MISCELLANEOUS RECORD

M.R.27678 - In re: John F. Pawloski. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Hearing Board is allowed, and Petitioner, John F. Pawloski is reinstated to the roll of attorneys licensed to practice law in Illinois pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 767 subject to the following conditions until further order of Court:

a. Petitioner shall comply with the provisions of Article VII of the Illinois Supreme Court Rules on Admission and Discipline of Attorneys and the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall timely cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations relating to his conduct;

b. Petitioner, upon reinstatement, shall comply with the Minimum Continuing Legal Education requirements for reinstated attorneys set out in Supreme Court Rule 791(f);

c. Petitioner shall continue his involvement in a 12-step program, such as Alcoholics Anonymous, attend at least one meeting a week, and maintain a log of such attendance, which he shall submit to the Administrator upon request;

d. If Petitioner practices law as a sole practitioner, he shall have a mentor acceptable to the Administrator for a period of five (5) years. Petitioner shall authorize the mentor to provide a report to the Administrator every six (6) months regarding the nature of Petitioner's work, the number of cases being handled, and a general appraisal of Petitioner's continued fitness to practice law;

e. Petitioner shall report to the Administrator any lapse in his sobriety or usage of alcohol, marijuana, or any un-prescribed controlled substances within seventy-two (72) hours of that usage;

f. Petitioner shall, as required by the Administrator, submit to random substance testing by a qualified health professional or facility approved by the Administrator, within eight (8) hours of receiving notice by the Administrator that he shall submit to the testing. The results of the test shall be reported to the Administrator. Petitioner shall pay all costs of such testing;

g. Within one year after his reinstatement, petitioner shall pay in full any restitution still owed for unearned fees to Barbara Costello or the James Hammel Estate, as approved by the Administrator;

h. Petitioner shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change of address; and

i. Petitioner's conditional reinstatement shall be revoked if petitioner is found to have violated any of the conditions of reinstatement, and petitioner shall be suspended from the practice of law until further order of the Court.
