M.R.028642 - In re: Jeffrey Mark Isaacson. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission for order and judgment for costs pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 773. Allowed. Costs in the amount of \$1,000 are assessed against Jeffrey Mark Isaacson, and he is directed to pay the costs in full to the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission within thirty (30) days of the entry of this order.

M.R.029119 - In re: Alan Louis Meserow. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b).

Allowed. Respondent Alan Louis Meserow is suspended from the practice of law for six (6) months and until further order of the Court, with the suspension stayed in its entirety by a one (1) year period of probation, subject to the following conditions:

- a. Respondent shall participate in psychotherapy with a therapist, approved by the Administrator, bi-monthly for at least six (6) months, then monthly for at least six (6) months, and shall report to the Administrator any change in attendance deemed warranted by such professional;
- b. Respondent shall comply with all treatment recommendations of his therapist and/or qualified mental health professional, including the taking of medications, if any, as prescribed;
- c. Respondent shall provide to the mental health professionals and/or facilities described in paragraphs (a) and (b), above, an appropriate release authorizing the treating professional or facility to (1) respond to any inquiries made by the Administrator regarding respondent's mental or emotional state or regarding the nature of and respondent's compliance with any established course of treatment or treatment plan, and (2) promptly report to the Administrator respondent's failure to comply with any part of an established course of treatment or treatment plan;
- d. Respondent shall attend meetings scheduled by the Commission probation officer and provide quarterly written reports regarding his compliance with and implementation of conditions, as requested by the Administrator;
- e. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change of address or any change in treating therapist;

- f. Respondent shall comply with the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall timely cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations relating to his conduct;
- g. At least thirty (30) days prior to the termination of the period of probation, respondent shall reimburse the Commission for the costs of this proceeding as defined in Supreme Court Rule 773 and shall reimburse the Commission for any further costs incurred during the period of probation;
- h. Probation shall be revoked if respondent is found to have violated any of the terms of probation. The six (6) month period of suspension shall commence from the date of the determination that any term of probation has been violated and shall continue until further order of the Court; and
- i. Probation shall terminate without further order of the Court provided that respondent complies with the above conditions.
